



Chocolate Face Pack

 $oldsymbol{1}$ Take one tablespoon of flour and add one teaspoon of cocoa powder.

2 Add to it one teaspoon of honey and enough milk to form a thick paste.

3 Whisk everything together.

4 Apply it on your face and leave it for five to ten minutes.

5 Scrub lightly and wash off with lukewarm water.

Preheat the oven to 180 C/350 F/Gas 4.




SOME OTHER CURSED PRINCES!
